THE Region 3 Amateur Red Setter Championship and supporting stakes were held on the grounds of Six Runs Plantation, south of Clinton, N. C. The weather was agreeable for the first time in four years and we are grateful.

This trial is normally supported by red setter enthusiasts from the entire East Coast. Though small in number this group is not short in dedication. Bob White came all the way from Connecticut. Pennsylvania was represented by Dr. Roger W. Boser and Paul Ober and family. Paul and Roger are two of the top amateur handlers in their area as attested by having won multiple amateur dog of the year awards. Dale Brunns, from Indiana, had two dogs entered. Mark Fulmer drove from Aikens. Mr. Jim Durock and myself represented North Carolina. We are all close friends and this trial is put on by all of us, everyone helping out wherever needed.

The judging was very capably handled by Clayton Myrick and G. B. Hatcher. Mr. Myrick is a young, very capable and highly respected dog trainer in our area. Mr. Hatcher is a top amateur handler who has trained trial or hunting bird dogs nearly all his life. Scott Beyer, another respected professional from New Jersey,

The grounds at Six Runs are made for running dogs, half-mile long fields and open woods make running dogs look good. All turns are natural and dogs are often

spied pointing a quarter of a mile away. Birds are released before the trial in coveys and are never short in number.

### THE WINNERS

It was Dr. Roger Boser all the way this year as Scarlet Fever continued her winning ways to show us at the age of nine she is still a formidable competitor. Dolly, as she is affectionately called, carded seven well spaced finds in her hour with a good ground effort to capture another title.

Pollywog, another Boser charge, was rewarded with runner-up. She had five sparkling finds with an excellent ground effort. She is truly a class shooting dog.

Six Runs Scrappy, handled by Ober, had the next best performance. She carded five well-spaced finds with one of the best ground efforts of the stake; however, her backing was something less than desirable.
